

The 17th Gimli Film Festival runs July 26 - 30, 2017



Gimli – July 5, 2017 – The Gimli Film Festival, RBC Emerging Artists Project and On Screen Manitoba are pleased to announce the finalists for this year’s RBC \$10,000 Emerging Filmmaker Competition. Five talented young filmmakers (listed below), selected by a jury organized by On Screen Manitoba, will present their story ideas, budgets and draft scripts to a panel of industry experts in front of a live audience at this year’s Gimli Film Festival.

Up-and-coming Manitoba filmmakers were invited to submit a written concept to be considered for this year’s competition. The preselection jury received a record-breaking 22 strong and diverse submissions. The five selected finalists represent some of the best emerging talent our province has to offer.

The filmmakers will have three minutes to pitch their short film ideas. The 2017 pitch competition winner will walk away with \$10,000 to make their film courtesy of the RBC Emerging Artists Project; a mentorship with industry professionals from the National Screen Institute; a \$2,500 gift certificate courtesy of William F. White. The completed film will premiere at the 2018 Gimli Film Festival.

Join us Saturday, July 29th at the Gimli Theatre - 74 2nd Avenue, Gimli. The pitch competition is FREE, open to the public and will run from 10:00 am to noon.
